The ESPON 2013 Programme

Role in Structural Funds 2007-2013:

- Support EU Cohesion Policy development with pan-European, comparable facts and evidence on Territorial Structures, Trends, Perspectives and Policy Impacts, focusing on European Regions and Cities, and revealing territorial capital, potentials and challenges.

Budget 2007-13:

- 47 mill Euro (ERDF 34 mill. Euro, plus 13 mill. Euro from 31 countries)

Programme Priorities:

- P 1: Applied Research
- P 2: Targeted Analyses based on Stakeholder interest
- P 3: Scientific Platform and Tools
- P 4: Capitalisation

Programme Delivery

Expected 64-65 larger projects during 2007-2013:

- 25 Applied Research projects
 - 21 projects ongoing, final or just starting
- 23 Targeted Analyses (defined by stakeholder demand):
 - 18 ongoing or closing
- 10 larger projects under Scientific Platform and Tools:
 - 4 larger projects ongoing/final
 - 6 additional larger projects starting early 2012
- 6-7 Transnational Networking Activities:
 - 5 projects ongoing

European Mindset for Placed-based Policy

Why a European Perspective in Policy Development?

Challenges for creating Growth and Cohesion:

- **Economic downturn and Crisis:** Asymmetric impact, recovery and unemployment, young generation, regional diversity, innovation towards green, low carbon economy
- **Connecting and changing World:** New emerging markets, era of new strong world economies (China, India, Brasil, etc.), a larger territorial context for Europe, connecting gateway regions and cities
- **Climate change:** Mitigation and adaptation, CO2 reduction targets, new hazard patterns and new territorial opportunities
- **Demographic changes:** Ageing of the population, internal migration flows and external migration pressures
- **Connectivity and accessibility:** Infrastructure deficits, transport increase, saturation of EU-corridors, environmentally friendly solutions
- **Energy challenge:** Security of supply, alternative energy sources, fluctuation of energy prices, diversity of regional vulnerability
- **EU Enlargement:** Geographic integration, Territorial imbalances, Integration of new territories, their regions and cities

Policy Directions for EU Cohesion Policy

Ambitions for Economic, Social And Territorial Cohesion

- Supporting intelligent, sustainable and inclusive growth
- Place-based, integrated development of regions and cities (promoting a functional area approach)
- Harvesting territorial potentials and converging challenges into opportunities (double track policy)
- Considering regional diversity a strength (calling for tailor made policy mixes unlocking potentials)
- Integration with sector policies (ensuring synergies)
- Cooperation (joining forces exploring comparative advantages and increasing joint critical mass)
- Governance (create condition for optimal delivery)
- Evidence-based and result-oriented activities (based on improved strategies and indicators)

What territorial priorities does Europe express?

Territorial Agenda 2020 for the EU

- Polycentric and Balanced Territorial Development
- Integrated development of cities, rural and specific regions
- Territorial integration in cross-border and transnational functional regions
- Global competitiveness of regions based on strong local economies
- Territorial connectivity for individuals, communities and enterprises
- Managing and connecting ecological, landscape and cultural values of regions

What responses do Europe voice?

European Orientations for Territorial Development

- Local Development approach (enhanced emphasis)
- Urban Development Platform:
 - Cities as drivers of economic growth
 - Networking of cities (neighbours and long distance)
 - Inclusion and sustainability
- Attention to challenges of specific types of regions
- Cross-border and transnational functional regions (such as Macro Regions)

Evidence and tools in particular demand

- Territorial Impact Assessment
- Functional Area approach

- Evidence base for integrated place-based policy development
- Support to Intelligent, Sustainable and Inclusive Growth
- Support Cohesion Policy in efficient, concrete results and Territorial Cohesion

- Benchmark Regions and Cities in European and global context
- Help tailor Interventions and Projects to rich European Regional Diversity
- Reveal possible synergies through cooperation
- Support spending EU Funds targeted and efficient

Progress towards ESPON post 2013:

- Ministers conclusion during Hungarian EU Presidency:
"Recognized that the ESPON (European Observation Network for Territorial Development and cohesion) Programme has demonstrated its ability to create useful pan-European territorial knowledge, and thus encourage the ongoing process to prepare the continuation of ESPON post-2013 conducted by Luxembourg.."
- EC draft Regulations to be published on 5 October 2011
- ESPON post 2013 previewed on the agenda at Ministerial meeting during Polish EU Presidency on 25 November 2011
